Goal: BBE Schools will have all graduating seniors demonstrate their college or career readiness by completing rigorous coursework prior to graduation.	The Class of 2024 had 68% of students accepted and attend a post-secondary college(FY24 was 81%); 29% of students entered the workforce (FY24 was 19%); while 2% of the class planned to serve a military branch. In FY24, BBE students earned 478 (decline of 79) college credits while attending BBE High School. College courses include offerings from Central Lakes e-College, passed Advanced Placement (AP) exams, Online College in the High School, College in the High School and Articulated Courses through our vocational programming. Overall, we had about 16 FTE students in college which is about 10% of our entire student body. BBE has 9-12th grade advisories divided by Jagways for specific programming purposes.
